

Overview of Official Languages

To ensure respect for English and French as the official languages of Canada and to ensure equality of status and equal rights and privileges as to their use in all federal institutions.

- ECCC's Official Languages Strategy Plan & Action Plan
- Official Language Act (OLA) Key Elements:

Responsibilities of central agencies: Treasury Board Secretariat (TBS) and Office of the Commissioner of Official Languages (OCOL) Communication with and services to the public through the **Active (Hello/Bonjour)**



Participation of English-speaking and
French-speaking Canadians (equal opportunities and equitable participation)

Work environment that respects and meets language of work requirements (for both employees and managers)

Know your Rights!

As employees in **bilingual regions**, we have overlapping rights and responsibilities including but not limited to:

- Having work tools in your desired official language;
- Being supervised in the Official Language of your choice;
- Having the right to express yourself in English or French (preparing documents & emails, during meetings, etc.);
- Having access to training in your desired official language;
- Understanding the responsibility to use the designated official language in a unilingual region;

Departmental Action Plan

Establishing language requirements of positions

Assessing a candidate in his/her Official Languages language of choice (selection process: exams, interviews, informal conversations, etc.)

Holding Bilingual Meetings


Establishing communicating performance management objectives (and conversations!) in the employee's language of choice


