On June 28, we held our interdepartmental <u>Ask Me Anything event, Celebrating Indigenous Voices in the Public Service,</u> in collaboration with the Department of National Defence.

June is <u>National Indigenous History Month</u>, and it is a time to honour the stories, achievements, and resilience of First Nations, Inuit and Métis. Our speakers shared their stories, reflections, cultures, and experiences on the Ask Me Anything stage to celebrate Indigenous voices in the public service.

Colonel David Grebstab, CD, Director of Middle East and Africa Policy with the Department of National Defence, opened the event. Colonel Grebstab is a Red River Métis citizen. He shared how he learned about his ancestry later in life and how he is embracing it now.

The event was hosted by Shawna Wolfe, Senior Policy Advisor, Indigenous Relations and Partnerships Policy Division at the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, and Sebastian Bob, Junior Internal Communications Officer at the Canadian Coast Guard. Shawna, who is a proud Red River Métis citizen, and Sebastian, whose ancestors were from Tahltan, Tlingit and Carrier nations, participated in the panel, sharing from their own lived experience.
