- ✓ Enable teams to **harness the real potential of data**.

GAC's 3 Data Standards

Introduced over the past year, each standards serves a distinct purpose, yet together form a **robust, cohesive and foundational framework** for managing data across the department - one that supports better decisions, consistent practices, and a shared understanding of information at every level.

- ❖ Provision of a consistent, homogeneous and reusable dataset structure.
- ❖ Documentation | Standardization | Templates | Governance
