Health Canada's Business Driver

- Numerous steps and resources involved in a simple update
- Requirement for weekend and after hours support
- Looking to lean out and simplify processes

Real-time updates on the COVID-19 exposure page

Principal Publisher worked with Health Canada to automate updates to the page on Canada.ca that advises Canadians of any possible exposure to COVID-19 during their recent travels. The team implemented a solution that pulls the information directly from the data source and displays it on the page. This eliminates the need for manual updates.

The solution went live on August 13, 2020. Principal Publisher delivered on this within 9 business days by leveraging the same solution used to display real-time updates regarding the number of COVID-19 cases and deaths.

Benefit to the client (Health Canada) and to the public:

- Simplifies the publishing process for Health Canada by eliminating the need to update the page manually each time new information presents itself
- Eliminates risk of human error and potential time lag in information being available to the public due to manual updates
- Enables the Government of Canada to equip Canadians with crucial information that potentially affects their health in a faster and more reliable manner
