





DGLEPM - Director General Land Equipment Program Management

Role

DGLEPM is the design, maintenance and acquisition authority for land equipment.

Example

The Director Armoured Vehicles Project Management 7 (DAVPM 7) Light Armoured Vehicle Upgrade (LAV UP) fleet will continue to be the backbone of the Army's combat vehicle fleet. The upgrades will be applied to 550 of the 651 vehicles in the Light Armoured Vehicle III fleet, with an option for up to 80 additional vehicles, extending LAV operational life until 2035.

DGAEPM - Director General Aerospace Equipment Program Management


Role

DGAEPM provides procurement, logistics and engineering support and technical airworthiness oversight for Air Force equipment and weapons systems.

Example

The CF-188 Hornet is a multipurpose, high-performance twin-engine fighter that can handle both air-to-air and air-to-ground combat. Canada has taken delivery of Hornets acquired from Australia to meet our commitments until delivery of its Future Fighter.

DGMEPM - Director General Maritime Equipment Program Management

Role

DGMEPM's role is the in-service maintenance and materiel support of the RCN's various fleets. Responsibilities include ensuring that in-service RCN platforms are technically safe to operate, technically ready, and environmentally compliant.

Example

The Royal Canadian Navy operates a wide variety of vessels from major surface combatants and submarines to coastal defence vessels, training ships, supply ships and auxiliary platforms such as barges and tugs. In the coming years, there are several new classes of vessels that will also be introduced, such as the Canadian Surface Combatant pictured below.

DGMSSC - Director General Materiel Systems and Supply Chain

Role

DGMSSC provides and manages both the Materiel Acquisition and Support (MA&S) framework and the Supply Chain to deliver optimized materiel support to CAF operations and Departmental activities.

Example

The Defence Supply Chain (DSC) community relies upon applications and technology to enable business objectives and support the CAF. The Director Materiel Systems Plans and Requirements is charged with overseeing the synchronized transformation of the DSC by working with stakeholders to collect, prioritize and sequence business enabling IM/IT requirements. This includes an ambitious modernization agenda that will deliver data capture and automation technology along with streamlined business processes for procurement, supply and maintenance.

DGIIP - Director General International Industry Programs

Role

The DGIIP mission is to develop, promote and execute international and industrial materiel programs and activities in support of Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) materiel acquisition by collaborating with other national and international government departments and agencies.

Example

The Canada-Norway Defence Materiel Cooperation Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) can be used to undertake a wide range of cooperative defence materiel activities between the Department of National Defence and the Norwegian Ministry of Defence, including exchanges of technical and equipment-related information; loans of equipment; exchanges of personnel, etc.

DG Proc Svcs -Director General Procurement Services

Role

DG Proc Svcs provides procurement, financial management support, and contracting services for information technology, telecommunications, command and control systems, cyber security, satellite systems, and space projects. The Division also provides requirements in support of Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) deployed operations, both domestic and international.

DGMPD (A&L) - Director General Major Project Delivery (Air & Land)

Role

DGMPD (Air & Land) manages the acquisition of large-scale air and army equipment.

Example

The Government of Canada is procuring 16 Airbus Defence and Space C-295W aircraft from Airbus as part of the Fixed-Wing Search and Rescue procurement project (FWSAR). These aircraft will take over the search and rescue duties currently being done by six CC-115 Buffalo aircraft and 12 CC-130 legacy Hercules aircraft.


DGMPD(Sea) -Director General Major Project Delivery (Sea)

Role

DGMPD(Sea) is responsible for the acquisition of major new sea equipment.

Shipbuilding Projects

- The Arctic and Offshore Patrol Ship (AOPS) project will build 6 ships to conduct sovereignty and surveillance operations in Canadian waters on all three coasts, including in the Arctic. The first ship, HMCS Harry DeWolf, has been delivered to the Royal Canadian Navy.
- The Joint Support Ship (JSS) project will build 2 ships to supply fuel, ammunition, spare parts and other supplies between ships at sea.
- The Canadian Surface Combatant (CSC) project will build 15 ships to defend Canadian waters and contribute to international naval operations.

- an offshore engineering degree accredited by a provincial professional engineering association
- English essential
- PG:

- Graduation with a degree from a recognized post-secondary institution, or
- Graduation with an applied degree from a recognized post –secondary institution, with a specialization such as Supply Chain Management, Procurement or other fields of specialization relevant to the position.
- Bilingual (BBB)

► ENG:

- Graduation avec diplôme en ingénierie d'une institution d'enseignement post-secondaire agréée par le bureau canadien d'agrément des programmes de génie (BCAPG), ou
