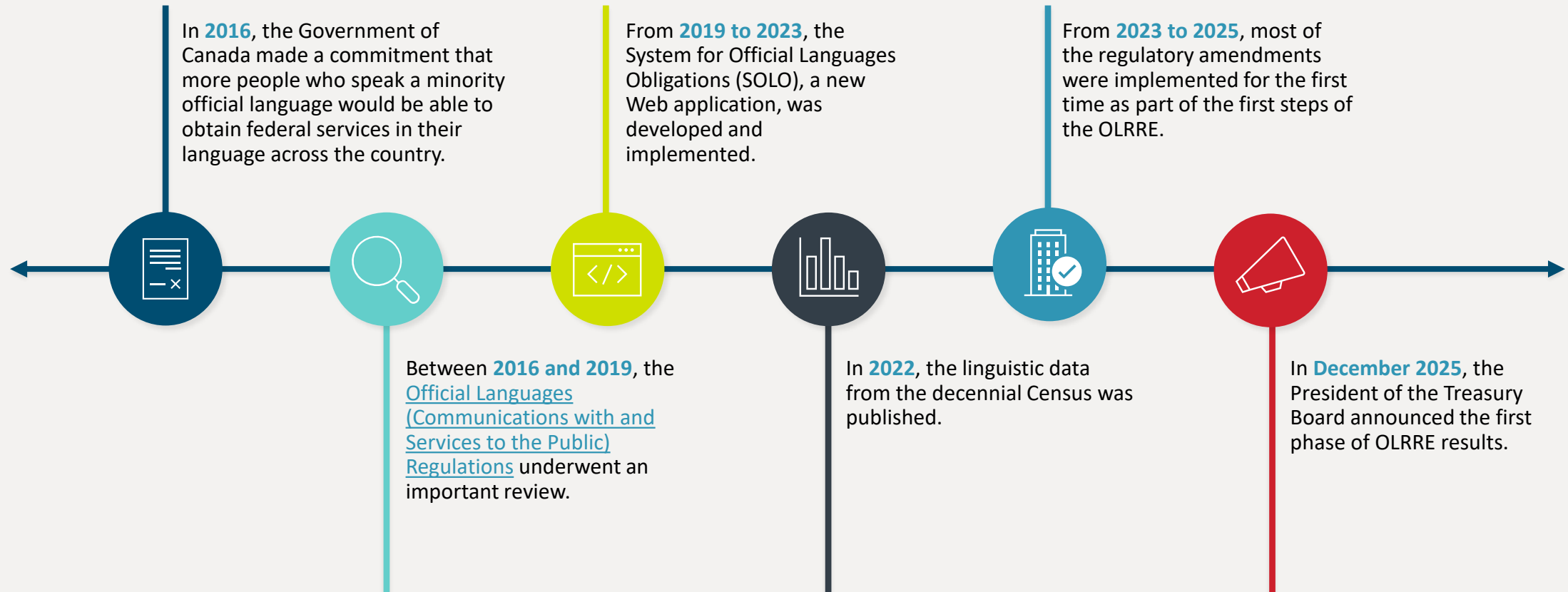

WHAT IS THE OLRRE?

This exercise is a legislative requirement undertaken every ten years following the publication of the linguistic data from the decennial census.

Federal institutions reapply the *Official Languages (Communications with and Services to the Public) Regulations* to confirm or modify the linguistic designation of federal points of service.

WHO IS RESPONSIBLE?

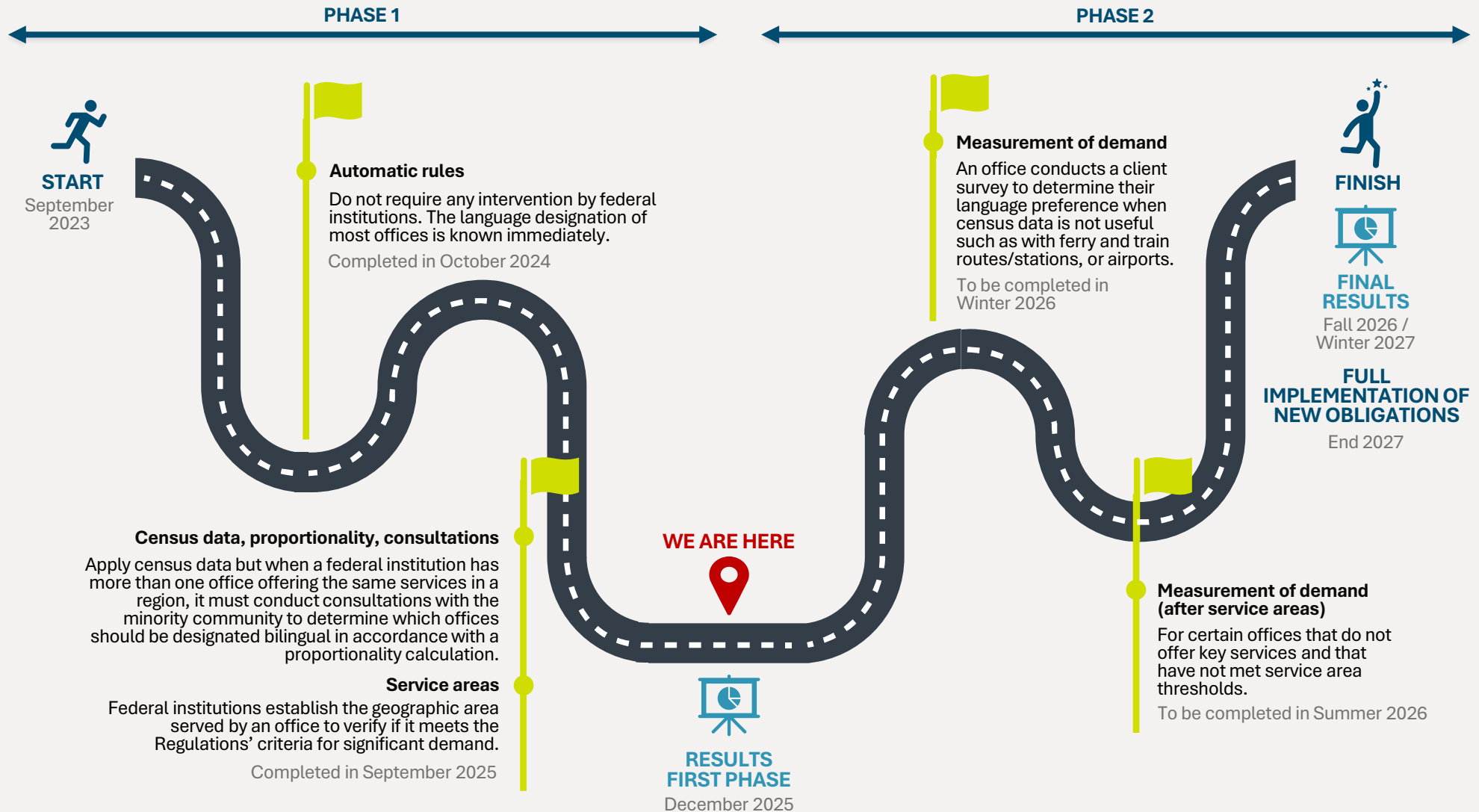


The Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat (TBS) coordinates the OLRRE and provides guidance and support to the federal institutions.



Federal institutions are responsible for applying the Part IV Regulations and undertaking the required actions to determine or verify their offices' language designation.

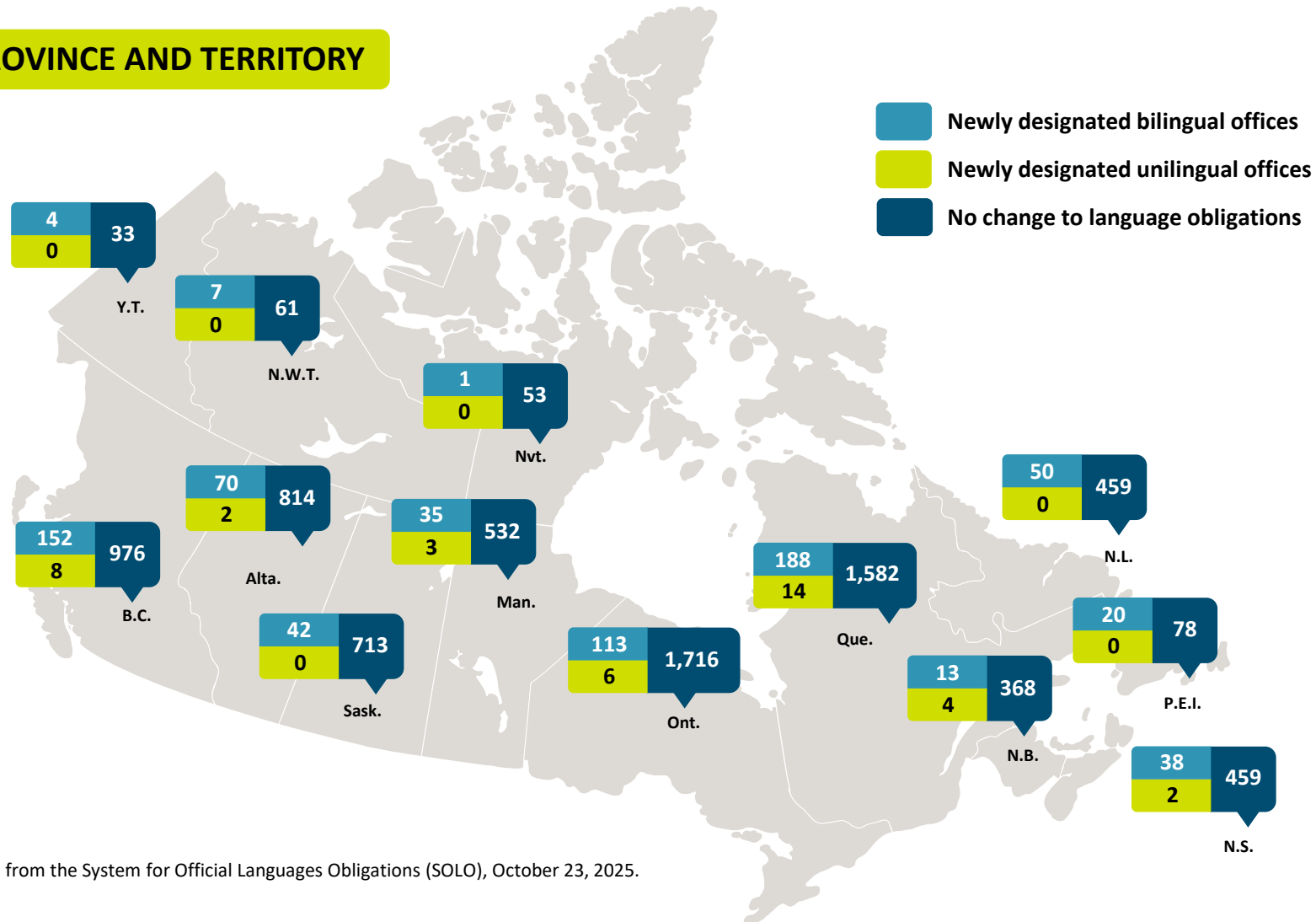


FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS WITH THE MOST NEWLY DESIGNATED BILINGUAL OFFICES



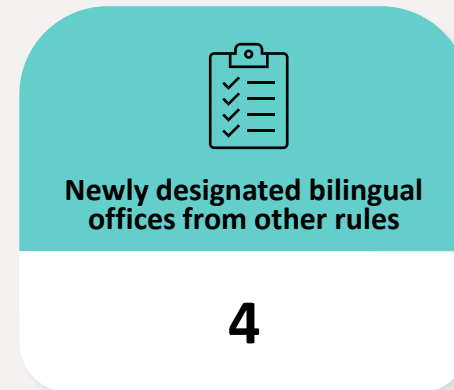
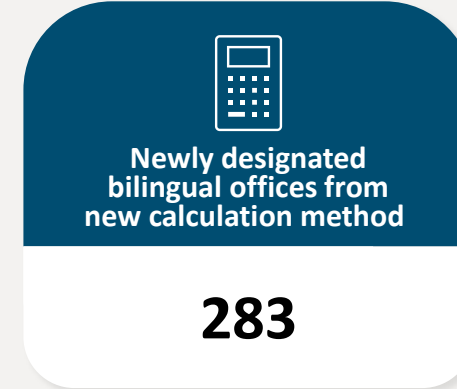

RESULTS BY PROVINCE AND TERRITORY

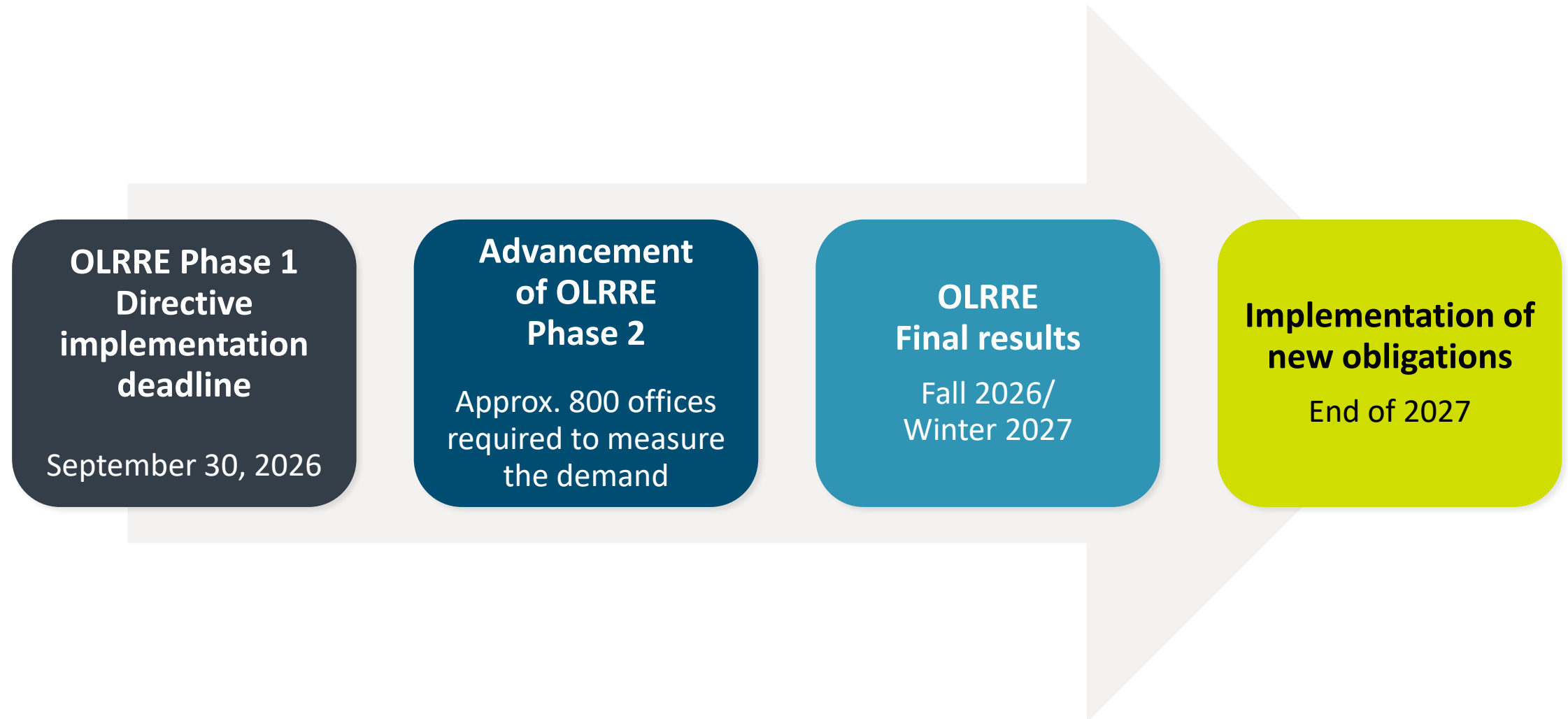
