How ESDC is making their ABW Inclusive and Accessible

Activity-based working, or ABW, is a design concept that recognizes that through the course of any day, employees engage in many different activities and that they need and can choose different types of work settings to accommodate these activities. The idea is that employees will be more productive when they have the right spaces for the tasks they need to accomplish.

Below are some of the inclusion and accessibility features available in your ESDC Workplace.

Work zones that include various types of workpoints

 Supports neurodiversity with a variety of spaces and functional zones that accommodate different sensory needs

Adjustable lighting

• To accommodate those with light sensitivity or visual impairments

All access washrooms

 Fully accessible universal washrooms with at least one adult change table at each work location

Wider hallways, circulation areas and entrances

• Reduces congestion and accommodates larger mobility devices

Sound attenuation systems

• System that masks ambient sounds and conversations to manage noise from different areas
