

Summary of previous activity (October 2023) Start Your Term with GC Students

1. Diverse work experience

- After your first student job with the Government of Canada, it is easier for a manager to **rehire you.**
- 2. Benefits
 - After 6 months of student employment working more than 12.5 hours per week and without a service break, you have access to insurance and pension fund.
- 3. Student Bridging
 - Following your studies, you can be hired through the student bridging process (external non-advertised process).

4. Service buyback

• Your years of work as a student worker can be counted as part of your working years for early retirement if you buy them back.

Plan Your Career Job Groups and Levels

Know Your Occupational Group

- Consult the resources to learn more about professional groups (PA/AS/EC/CS/...):
 - Occupational groups for the public service Canada.ca
- Look at the job advertisements on <u>GC Jobs</u> and add filters to your search or search for job titles (ex: finance).
 - **Tip:** Look at the titles and salaries to give you an idea if this is an entrylevel position.

Workers and employees of the GC:

- Ask your colleagues about their professional group.
- Contact people working in the field you are interested in by searching <u>GCdirectory</u>.
- Consult <u>Career Marketplace GC connex</u>

Know Your Level

Once you know your (groups), you need to know the levels you qualify for.

- Look at the job advertisements on <u>GC Jobs</u>
 - Look at the job ads and check the essential qualifications.
 - If you meet the essential qualifications of the position, it means the level can be right for you.
 - Note: This does not automatically mean that you can apply!

Workers and employees of the GC

- Ask your colleagues!
- Log in to <u>GC Jobs</u> with your GC email address or while connected to your department/agency network.
 - Add a filter to select your classification and start searching for the lowest levels (see image).
 - Look at the tabs for internal and external jobs



Employment Types

- Government of Canada workers (external)
 - Student employment
 - Part-time worker
 - <u>Casual employment</u>
- To become a public servant
 - Determinate Contract (end date)
 - Indeterminate Contract (no end date)
- For public servants (internal)
 - <u>Deployment</u> (at level)
 - <u>Acting</u>
 - <u>Secondments and assignments</u>
 - Determinate Contract (end date)
 - Indeterminate Contract (no end date)
 - Promotion (ex: AS-01 to AS-02)



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Appointment Processes



*Students are considered external employees and are not public servants.

** Students may be eligible in some cases.

*** Public servants go through an internal non-advertised process (equivalent).

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Appointment Processes - Description

- Note: Students are not considered to be members of the public service.
- Advertised: Job postings on <u>GC Jobs</u>.
 - External: everyone.
 - **Internal:** persons belonging to the public service (students sometimes included).
- Non-advertised: Job postings are not posted.
 - External: everyone.
 - Internal: persons belonging to the public service.

Finding a job by process

- External advertised appointment process:
 - A. Check regularly for available jobs on <u>GC Jobs.</u>
- External non-advertised appointment process (Student Bridging):
 - A. Start networking now.
 - B. Be a member of Facebook groups (GC informal)

Workers and employees of GC, also consider:

- Internal advertised Appointment Process:
 A. Regularly review available jobs on <u>GC</u>
 - Jobs and verify that students are eligible.
 - External non-advertised appointment process:
 - A. Search <u>GCdirectory</u> to expand your network.
 - B. Go to the Career Marketplace GC connex.



Pools and Inventories

What is a GC pool? Concept in a nutshell

Definitions

- Being part of a pool: a person has successfully demonstrated at all stages of a selection process that he or she meets the Statement of Merit Criteria.
- Statement of Merit Criteria (SoMC): set of elements, including level of education, work experience, skills and comfort working in official languages, that are required to occupy a position.



What you need to know about a pool

Steps to qualify for a pool

- Find a process with a pool: Go to GC Jobs and consult the job offers.
- **During a selection process:** Candidates are assessed to see if they meet the Statement of Merit Criteria (SoMC).
- At the end of the process: 10 candidates may be qualified (they meet the SoMC), but only one position may be available. They will all receive a communication telling them that they are part of the pool of qualified candidates and may be contacted by the manager if he or she wishes to offer them the position.

Why qualify in a pool?

- Being qualified in a pool is attractive to managers since you've already proven that you meet the statement of merit criteria.
 - Demonstrate to your manager that you're ready for a promotion.
 - Network with managers to find a new job.

Student Recruitment Programs

Student Recruitment Programs

- Federal Student Work Experience Program (FSWEP)
 - You must be considered a full-time student by your school.
 - You are returning to full-time studies in the next academic year.
- <u>Research Affiliate Program</u>
- Post-Secondary CO-OP/Internship Program
 - You must be a full-time student registered in a post-secondary coop/internship program that is on our <u>list of validated institutions</u> and programs.
- Specialized recruitment programs

Graduate Recruitment Programs

Graduate recruitment programs

- Post-Secondary Recruitment
 - Recruitment campaign (around November)
 - You are eligible if you have a college or university diploma, or if you will be graduating shortly.
- <u>Recruitment of Policy Leaders</u>
 - We recommend that you <u>read the list of requirements</u> to assess whether you are meeting the expectations of the program.
- <u>Virtual Door to Talent for Persons with a Disability</u>
- Indigenous Career Pathways
- Other specialized recruitment initiatives

Find a job on GC Jobs

For **External Advertised** Appointment Processes and **Internal Advertised** Appointment Processes, here is what you need to do to apply.

- 1. Visit <u>GC Jobs</u>.
- 2. Select the group and level that suits you.
- 3. Select the type of employment (term/indeterminate).
- 4. Check the eligibility criteria, or area of selection (place of residence, originating department/agency, employment equity members, etc.).
- 5. Check that you meet the essential qualifications for the position (education, language, experience, etc.).

To answer the pre-selection questions, use the STAR method after mentioning the what, where and when (e.g.: As a student at Parks Canada in 2023, I...I).

Start with **S** for situation, the general description that gives an overall vision, **T** for task, the mission and objective to be achieved, **A** for action, all the actions you have taken to achieve the task, and **R** for result, which highlights the effects of your actions, notably by mentioning qualitative and quantitative data.

Find a process with pool

In the <u>GC Jobs</u> job posting, consult the process intention section to validate whether a pool will be created.

Intent of the process

The intent is to staff one indeterminate position. A pool of qualified candidates (fully assessed or partially assessed) will be established and may be used to staff similar positions in this group and level. This process may be used for various positions and tenures (including but not limited to term and indeterminate appointments, internal assignments, secondments, deployments and acting appointments).

Indigenous Student Employment Opportunity (ISEO) and Employment Opportunity for Students with Disabilities (EOSD)

- The programs include trainings, a mentoring program, events and support services for students.
 - The <u>Indigenous Student Employment Opportunity (ISEO)</u> is a program for students hired into the public service who self-identify as Indigenous under the <u>Federal Student Work Experience Program</u> (FSWEP).
 - The <u>Employment Opportunity for Students with Disabilities</u> (EOSD) is a program for hired students who self-identify as having a disability through the <u>Federal Student Work Experience Program</u> (FSWEP).

How do I register for the ISEO and EOSD?

- Indigenous students and / or students with disabilities who are employed by the Government of Canada must register by completing the <u>form</u>.
- Hiring managers or human resource specialists may also complete the <u>Registration Form</u> on behalf of students.





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Additional Resources

Second Language Evaluation

- Note: The languages of the position must be met at the time of appointment.
 - X: Performance does not meet the minimum requirements
 - A: Beginner level
 - B: Intermediate level
 - C: Advanced level
 - E: Exemption
- Second Language Evaluation (Reading, Writing, Oral)
 - CBC (Reading: Advanced, Writing: Intermediate, Oral: Advanced)
 - BBB (**Reading:** Intermediate, **Writing:** Intermediate, **Oral:** Intermediate)
- <u>Self-assessment tests</u>: Try the self-assessment tests for reading comprehension and written expression before taking the official tests.




