# Strengthened monitoring

## Monitoring of federal institutions' compliance

- More detailed information and supporting evidence are now required
- The responses, clarifications and supporting evidence provided are reviewed and validated by the Official Languages Centre of Excellence (OLCE)

## Results of an official languages review

- May serve as a starting point for an audit or an evaluation (to come)

## Available tools

### Tools related to reporting

- Official Languages Accountability and Reporting Framework
- Monitoring tools
  - 2025-2027 official languages review cycle
  - Instruction sheet and presentation on official languages reviews
  - Presentation on official languages statistical data
  - FAQs and user guide for SOLO (System for Official Languages Obligations)
- Audit and evaluation tools
  - Information session for persons responsible for official languages (PROLs) and persons responsible for Part VII of the Act (PRP7s). Monitoring, audit and evaluation

# 2025–26 reviews: Fewer questions, but more targeted

## New cycle, two priorities

- Strengthening monitoring by the OLCE
- Reducing administrative burden

## Key areas of focus for the 2025–2027 cycle

- Priority on parts V and VII of the act
- Part V: Significant gaps persist
- Part VII: Need a clear picture of institutions' current level of understanding and compliance in order to identify issues and adjust tools if needed

## New questionnaire

- Half the questions and sub-questions than in the 2023–2025 cycle
- Half the number of requests for clarifications or documents

## Instruction sheet

- Completely revised
- Essential to refer to it

# Why a review?

## **Legislative requirement: *Official Languages Act***

- The Treasury Board is required to table an annual report on official languages (AROL) in Parliament every year

## **Annual Report on Official Languages**

- The results of the reviews are used to draft the AROL
- The Treasury Board may name, in the AROL, any institution that does not submit a review
- The AROL is used to report on federal institutions' compliance with the act

## **Institutional diagnostic**

- Identify strengths and challenges related to official languages
- Highlight trends and good practices

## **Other uses for your reviews**

- To communicate your achievements to stakeholders
- To develop implementation tools
- To document and track progress in institutions

# What is the official languages monitoring exercise?

## Two key components

### Official languages review questionnaire

#### Divided into sections

### Data on official languages and your workforce

- Collection of statistical data on your workforce (resources that provide services to the public, first official language of employees, language requirements for management, and so on)

#### Institutions that use the Position and Classification Information System (PCIS)

- Update your official languages data in your human resources system by March 31
- Data is extracted using the PCIS

#### Institutions that don't use the PCIS

- Enter official languages statistical data in SOLO (System for Official Languages Obligations)
- Information sessions will be held for relevant federal institutions in late March

# What's new: Highlights

- No questions on equitable participation
- Only two questions on communications with and services to the public (linked to performance indicators)
- Only one question on Part IV in the Human Resources Management section (related to the reapplication exercise)

The new questions focus on:

- Part V
- Part VII (section fully revised and updated)

Integration of multiple-choice questions:

- Allows several answers to be selected for a given question

Instruction sheet:

- Overhauled and enhanced

# What to watch for?

## Instruction sheet

- Refer to it every time it is mentioned in a question in SOLO, **before** you draft your response

## Clear and precise responses

- Provide accurate, clear and concise information related only to the question asked
- Indicate precisely **where to find the relevant elements in the documents you provide**

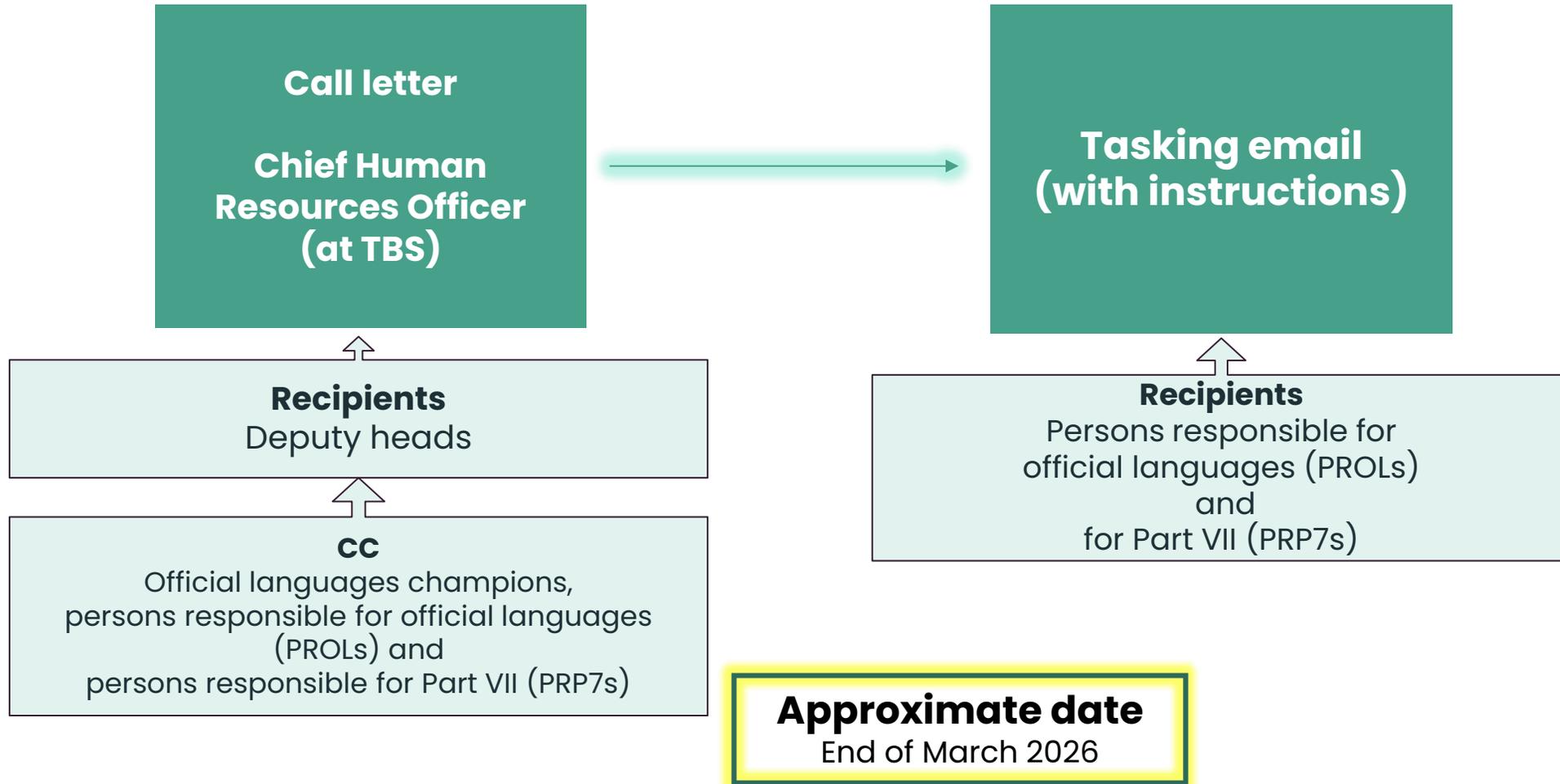
## Responses in both official languages

- Provide answers in **both English and French** in the comment boxes
- Documents intended for Parliament must be submitted in both official languages

## Meeting submission deadlines

- Submit your review by the deadline **to prevent delays in the drafting of the AROL and tabling it in Parliament**
