

#### TRIBAL WARRIOR CRUISE - Friday 25 January 2019, 4:00pm - 6:00pm.

- The <u>Tribal Warrior</u> is a not-for-profit Aboriginal community organisation initiated and directed by Aboriginal people in partnership with Aboriginal Elders. The cruise will tell stories of the Cadigal, Guringai, Wangal, Gammeraigal and Wallumedegal people of Sydney Harbour and teach the Aboriginal names and meanings of significant Sydney landmarks.
- This cruise takes place on Sydney Harbour, and as such is subject to prevailing weather conditions. The vessel, the Mari Nawi, is a covered charter boat, with some open decks for viewing.
- For your comfort, it is suggested you wear appropriate covered shoes, bring sun protection (sunglasses, hats, sunscreen), and also an outer layer (light jacket). Sun screen will also be made available on the cruise for delegates use.
