About the Virtual Kiosks

The 3D interactive virtual kiosks use visual images, decorative text and interactive hotspots with descriptive cards to communicate information about a specific topic. Participants have the ability to rotate the kiosk to view the different panels, zoom in to content as they hover over hotspots, and see a call to action encouraging them to click on the hotspot link.

All kiosks are available in both official languages, and include a mobile/accessible version for those using mobile devices, older web browsers that are not compatible with the technology, or for those using assistive technology (e.g. screen readers).

Kiosk Design Specifications

Each kiosk is composed of 4 panels (left, central, right, and title). The design specifications are outlined below. Please follow the dimensions carefully as these will have an impact in the integration of the design in the final 3D kiosk.

Panel specifications:

- Kiosk panel dimensions: 2,000 px (width) X 3,000 px (height)
 - o Do not add any interactive design elements (hotspots) in the dead zone area.
- Title panel dimensions: 1,800 px (width) X 540 px (height)
 - By default, only 1 title panel is included on the central panel of the kiosk. It is, however, possible to include a title panel on each panel.

Exporting your kiosk image files

Once your kiosk designs are finalized in both official languages, you need to export image files, which will be used to create the 3D version of the kiosk.

Export each individual kiosk panel as .jpg files.

You should have a total of 8 panels (4 panels per language): left, central, right, and title.

Name each image file using the following naming convention:

- 1. English right panel: Kxxxxxx EnCA Right
- 2. French right panel: Kxxxxxx_FrCA_Right
- 3. English center panel: Kxxxxxx EnCA Center

- 4. French center panel: Kxxxxxx_FrCA_Center
- 5. English left panel: Kxxxxxx_EnCA_Left
- 6. French left panel: Kxxxxxx_FrCA_Left
- 7. English center title panel: Kxxxxxx_EnCA_CenterTitle
- 8. French center title panel: Kxxxxxx_FrCA_CenterTitle
