WHAT IS THE OLRRE?


This exercise is a legislative requirement undertaken every ten years, following the publication of the linguistic data from the decennial census, during which federal institutions reapply the *Official Languages (Communications with and Services to the Public) Regulations* to confirm the linguistic designation of federal points of service.




RESULTS OF THE FIRST PHASE OF THE OLRRE
